A. ABOUT COECSA

The College of Ophthalmology of Eastern, Central and Southern Africa (COECSA) is a specialized virtual college. The college was registered in 2012 with the aim to address the chronic shortage of ophthalmologists in Eastern, Central and Southern Africa (ECSA) as well as improve the quality of eye care services in the region.

COECSA's mandate is to support development of human resource for health through quality training in ophthalmology at residency and subspecialty level; set standards for professional ophthalmic practice; facilitate continuing professional development; contribute to health policy development; advocate for relevant policy changes in the region; promote research which advances ophthalmology in the region; and, create a forum for the ophthalmic practitioners to promote the profession and exchange skills and knowledge.

The Colleges primary geographic focus is the ECSA region currently comprising of 12 countries. These include Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, Rwanda, Burundi and Malawi. Others are Ethiopia, Zambia, South Sudan, Zimbabwe, Somalia and Mozambique.

B. THE COECSA EXAMINATIONS

1) Background

COECSA administers its own written examinations that supplements the traditional Clinical Fellowship Exam. This allows the COECSA Exam to be a complete stand-alone pathway to qualification as an Ophthalmologist, when complemented by training in an accredited facility that delivers and tracks learning as described in the COECSA Residency curriculum.

The written exam is also a pre-requisite to sitting the COECSA Fellowship Exam for any ophthalmologist who would like to become Fellows of the College. The COECSA Fellowship is awarded after completion of the four (4) Exams namely;

- **Written Part 1A:** Basic Ophthalmic Sciences
- **Written Part 1B:** Optics, Refraction and Instruments
- **Written Part 2:** Clinical Ophthalmology
- **Clinical Fellowship Part 3:** OSCE and VIVA

In 2026, the Exams calendar will be as follows:

A) WRITTEN EXAMS SESSION 1: **Written Part 2: Clinical Ophthalmology.**

- Exam Date: **23rd January, 2026**

B) WRITTEN EXAMS SESSION 2 [Joint]: **Written Part 1A & 1B: Basic Sciences, and Optics, Refraction and Instruments**

- Exam Day: **25th March, 2026.**

C) **WRITTEN EXAMS SESSION 3: Written Part 2: Clinical Ophthalmology.**

- Application Period: **1st March to 30th April, 2026.**
- Exam Day: **19th June, 2026.**

D) **CLINICAL FELLOWSHIP EXIT EXAM:**

- Application Period: **23rd June to 19th July, 2026.**
- Exam Days: **22nd – 24th August, 2026.**
- Venue: Kampala, Uganda

E) **EXAMS SESSION 4 [Joint]: – Written Part 1A & 1B: Basic Sciences, and Optics, Refraction and Instruments**

- Exam Day: **23rd/24th September, 2026.**

2) Eligibility

a) **Written Part 1A and Part 1B**

- ✓ A Resident who has been in training for at least 12 months will be eligible to sit for Part 1A and/or Part 1B.
- ✓ A practicing Ophthalmologist who would like to become a Fellow of COECSA or wish to assess their ophthalmic knowledge will be eligible.
- ✓ A candidate can sit Part 1A and Part 1B during the same sitting, and in any order.

b) **Written Part 2**

- ✓ A candidate will be eligible to sit for Part 2 Exams after passing Part 1A and Part 1B.
- ✓ A candidate who sat and passed ICO Part 1A and Part 1B before June 2023, will be eligible to sit Part 2 Exam.

3) Exemptions

- ✓ Candidates who have sat and passed ICO Exams before June 2023, will be exempt from sitting the corresponding COECSA written exam paper to qualify for the next exam. They will only be required to provide proof of having sat and passed the corresponding ICO exams, and apply to be awarded the equivalent COECSA certificate for any Part passed.
- ✓ There will be no exemption for qualified Ophthalmologists who would like to become fellows of the College, except as above. Qualified ophthalmologists will be required to sit and pass all the COECSA written exams before sitting the Clinical Fellowship Exam.

4) Registration/Application

A candidate who meets the eligibility requirements in (3) above, will be required to complete the online application process at this link: <https://coecsa.online-ap1.com/>, once the application process commence. They will also be required to complete the subsequent verification process by providing proof of eligibility as will be requested by COECSA.

5) Examination Centers

Candidates will be required to sit for the COECSA Written Exam in an accredited examination center nearest to them. Information on the accredited Examination Centers is availed on application portal during the registration process.

6) Exam Fees

a. Written Exams

The fees for the COECSA Written Exams are as Follows;

- a) Joint OF/COECSA Part 1A: Visual/Basic Ophthalmic Sciences = **\$155**
- b) Joint OF/COECSA Part 1B: Optics and Refraction = **\$130**
- c) COECSA Part 2: Clinical Ophthalmology = **\$180**

NOTE: All fees include an Examination Center Admin Fee of **\$30**

b. Clinical Fellowship Exam

The fee for sitting COECSA Fellowship examination is **USD 250** broken down as follows;

- a) Examination Fee = **\$200**
- b) Administration Fee = **\$50**

NOTE: Candidates will only be required to pay the fees upon formal acceptance to sit the Exam. Payments should be made to:

7) June 2026 timetable

- **Part 2 – Clinical Ophthalmology:** 09.00Am – 12.30Pm (EAT)
